

Goals

General goals

- Meaningful occupation
 - Anaby (2012): key elements for promoting well-being → the balance that a person experiences in his daily life occupations
 - Hakansson (2006): engagement in personally meaningful occupations → mechanism to experience balance in everyday life
 - Griffith (2007): intrinsic link between identity and occupations
 - Phinney (2007): important driving force for people with dementia → being active as much as they can
 - Steultjens (2011): shared occupations → important for people with dementia
 - Marshall (2010): more satisfaction → more engagement in activities

Goals

Goals mobile kitchen

- Participation of all residents
 - Let multiple residents enjoy
 - Generate attention through the scent of the meal
 - Goal for residents with dementia: arouse attention by sensory stimulation
- Personal development of the residents
 - Physically
 - Mentally

- Mental stimulation and activation
 - Reminiscence
- Express knowledge
- Feeling useful

• Frame	Inox
• Wheels with brakes	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• With elastic rubber• Nylon
• Hot plate	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Gas• Induction plate
• Electricity supply	As few cables as possible
• Hood	standard
• Handle

Guidelines mobile kitchen

Technical aspects

- Tips
 - When often using an elevator, make sure that the mobile kitchen fits into your elevator
 - The more facilities you want to put into the mobile kitchen, the more expensive it will be and the more heavy and clumsy he will be to handle

Guidelines mobile kitchen

Practical view on the mobile kitchen

- Pay special attention to:
 - Always include a fire blanket
 - Choose the tools that are for you the best ones to put in the cupboards. Not everything has to be in it.
 - Make sure you put the mobile kitchen on to a stable surface
 - Put at least two brakes on hold
 - Make sure that cables are put away neatly

Aperitiefhapjes

Augurken in het zuur

Benodigdheden:

- 1kg kleine augurken
- 1 liter azijn
- 10 peperbolletjes
- zout

Werkwijze:

Neem gelijke, kleine augurken, wrijf ze glad met zout, waarin je ze een dag laat trekken.

Spoel de augurken af met azijn.

Doe de augurken in bokalen of flessen met brede hals en overgiet met kokende azijn waarin de peperbollen gekookt werden.

Sluit de bokalen af na afkoeling.

Jonge kaas met kerstomaatjes of druiven

Werkwijze:

Dikke plakken kaas in blokjes snijden

Kerstomaatjes in twee snijden en met een prikkertje op de blokjes kaas steken of druiven op de kaas steken. Presenteren op een halve augurk.
